Making tariff pricing data easier to share, empowering consumer flexibility

What's happening?

DESNZ is introducing a change to the Retail Energy Code (REC). This will create a standardised API for tariff pricing data. This will prescribe:


- What data must be shared and in what format
- How suppliers make it available to approved third parties to optimise Energy Saving Appliances (ESA)

Why does it matter?

Tariff pricing data isn't easy to access or use. It's often in inconsistent formats that machines can't read.

This prevents ESAs from connecting with supplier tariffs, limiting opportunities to help consumers save energy and money.

What's the solution?



The new REC Tariff Interoperability Arrangements Schedule sets out how this will work

What's next?

October 2025 - Launch Consultation

March 2026 - Designate Changes to the REC, based on Consultation feedback

January 2027 - Roll out Arrangements and Obligations
